8.1 Parks Dept Update - Adrienne

Adrienne reported that the hanging baskets were removed the 1st week of September due to an aphid infestation.

Also, the 27 new Planter Urns will be emptied next week and remain empty until after Remembrance Day when the fall display will be presented. Adrienne asked that due to the size an number of urns, that we increase the budget from \$1,000 to \$2,000.

Adrienne also reported that she has sourced a secure urn cover at a cost of \$135 each. We'll need to have these covers ready for mid January when the fall displays are removed.

Councillor Rymal reported that the Memorial Gardens grand opening is scheduled for October 28th.
